1. Introduction

This Vision has been developed to set out the Parish Council's objectives and aspirations for the period 2014 – 2018. The vision has been developed by Councillors and Council staff.

2. The Parish Council's Vision for Worth Parish:

To make Worth Parish an attractive, safe and vibrant place to live and work.

3. The Aim of Worth Parish Council:

To ensure the character and unique environment of the villages and open space in the parish is protected and improved for future generations of residents.

4. The Parish Council's Values:

- To work with and listen to local residents, community groups and businesses and try to support them in appropriate local developments.
- To use Council influence to shape the future services and development of the Parish area.
- To seek benefits for the local area.
- To ensure Neighbourhood Plans reflect and meet long term challenges in the area.

5. Main aims:

- To enhance communication between the Council and the local community
- To enhance leisure and recreational facilities within the Parish
- To continue to support and improve the Parish Council's responsibilities:
 - o Village Greens, Play areas, Skate parks, Football and other Sports Fields,
 - Allotments
 - Crawley Down Cricket field,
 - Crawley Down King George V Field,
 - Copthorne King George V Field,
 - o Copthorne Jubilee Pavilion,
 - Crawley Down Car Park(s)
- To seek Improvements to Highway Infrastructure,
- To seek to improve local retail opportunities, including disabled parking,
- To enhance community safety and reduce the fear of crime,
- To be actively involved in production and implementation of Neighbourhood Plans.

6. Objectives within first 2 years:

The Parish Council

- Produce Vision for the Council; and integrate with Neighbourhood Plans.
- Champion Neighbourhood Plans to ensure maximum community benefit.
- Examine options and apply for funding of new community facilities and initiatives.
- Create a more outward focus in the community. There is a need for a more visible
 office, in keeping with a Quality Parish Council, which can act as a one-stop shop to
 provide a range of services and act as a contact point for other agencies.
- Investigate feasibility of having one morning a week contact point in the village not hosting the main office.
- Provide a higher profile in the community: improve website; expand input to Parish Newsletter; use Facebook effectively.
- Expand partnership working with: the police; District and County Councils; local organisations providing youth and elderly services; neighbouring Town and Parish councils.

Community Safety

- Maintain and improve relationships between the Parish Council, the community and the Police to encourage improved community Policing.
- Support re-establishment of Neighbourhood watch.
- Support local youth initiatives to help prevent anti-social behaviour.
- Encourage local sport and recreational initiatives to involve youths.

Traffic Management

- Establish better relationship with civil enforcement officers over anti-social parking.
 Investigate feasibility of employing our own patrols.
- Review sites for traffic lights to aid road crossings and traffic calming measures. Perceived main points for this are: B2118, A264, Brookhill Road, Copthorne Bank.
- Investigate funding options for these measures.
- Examine traffic calming options with County Council Highways Department.

Development Planning

- Ensure Neighbourhood Plans reflect the community wishes.
 - Highlight local infrastructure issues with new developments: power; water; drainage; transport.
 - Highlight local sustainability issues as part of the planning process with the District and County councils.
 - Through Neighbourhood Plans identify sites for future private, affordable and social housing in the parish.
 - o Champion additional sporting and recreational facilities.
 - o Investigate provision of sustainable business units for start-up light industrial and office-based enterprises. If sustainable support them.

- Ensure neighbourhood plans are approved to maximise any future income from Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL).
- Improve dialogue with the planning authority to ensure that section 106 and CIL payments benefit the community.

- Survey requirements of the young and elderly in the Parish and produce a list of achievable aims.
- Work toward achieving those aims.

• Examine options for improving and maintaining community transport. Support most viable and affordable.
